A project resulting from the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) to include all costs to administer and purchase and Install dark fiber infrastructure across 10 local government jurisdictions in order to interconnect local government, state and private networks, to improve public safety operability, foster economic development and to directly connect over 800 community anchor institutions including schools, libraries and community centers, and other public facilities as needed.
