Robbery

Columbia, 21044: 5500 block of Cedar Lane, Apr. 10 12:29 p.m.

An adult male victim reported he was walking along a footpath when he was approached by two male suspects who demanded money. When the victim refused, the suspects assaulted him and stole his wallet before fleeing. No serious injuries were reported. Through investigation, police identified the suspects and arrested them.

A group of people were inside the residence when an acquaintance displayed a handgun and demanded their cell phones and a watch. The suspect fled in a vehicle with another male subject. No one was injured. The investigation is ongoing.
