

# Howard County COVID-19 Rental Assistance and Eviction Prevention Round 2

## FACT SHEET

Beginning October 5, 2020, Howard County residents may contact one of the participating providers to complete an application for assistance to pay past due rent and/or mortgage payments and/or to prevent eviction. Maximum assistance per household is 3 months of housing expense.

### Preliminary application criteria:

1. Applicant must be a Howard County resident and provide proof of home address.
2. Applicant must provide evidence of loss of income due to COVID-related job loss, reduction in hours and/or medical illness.



### Special Exceptions:

If you rent a unit in a property owned by the Howard County Housing Commission, you may be eligible for rental assistance from the Howard County Housing Commission. Residents should contact the property managers in their buildings to apply.

If you rent a unit owned or managed by Bridges to Housing Stability, you may be eligible for rental assistance from Bridges to Housing Stability. Residents may contact Bridges to Housing Stability directly at [bridges2hs.org](http://bridges2hs.org) or (410) 312-5760.

### Partnership with Making Change

The County is partnering with Making Change, Inc. to provide free financial counseling to residents affected by a loss of income due to COVID-19. The counseling will include budget preparation and contacting creditors for assistance. Counseling is not required to receive rental assistance funds. ### Legal Support for those Facing Eviction

On September 8, 2020, County Executive Calvin Ball announced \$60,581 in CARES Act funding for Maryland Legal Aid (MLA) to assist residents facing eviction and other legal challenges exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. The grant will help provide the education, assistance and representation needed to prevent evictions in forthcoming failure to pay rent proceedings.
