“I refuse to accept the view that mankind is so tragically bound to the starless midnight of racism and war that the bright daybreak of peace and brotherhood can never become a reality...I believe that unarmed truth and unconditional love will have the final word,” says Martin Luther King Jr, the American Christian minister and activist who became the most outspoken person and leader in the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. thought of the need to put an end to racial injustices because it is illegal to treat people differently because of their race or culture which limits their confidence and makes them feel uncomfortable.
