Assault arrest update

Police have arrested a third suspect believed to have conspired in the assault of a man at a Jessup BP gas station in October. Antwan Mayhew, 37, of no fixed address, is charged with conspiracy to commit murder and accessory after the fact. This follows the arrests of two other suspects earlier this month. Police believe that Mayhew drove one of the suspects to the gas station for the purpose of committing the assault. Paul Albritton, 52, of Sykesville, was struck in the head with a two-by-four wooden board and currently remains in a long-term care facility.

Opioid overdose

Since the Mon., Dec. 18 daily crime bulletin, police responded to two non-fatal overdoses. Narcan was administered and in one of the cases, the person was transported to the hospital.

2017 YTD Total Overdoses:

Fatal: 55*

Non-Fatal: 168

*In fatal cases, some deaths are pending autopsy results for opioids and/or other substances. Numbers may fluctuate.

Of the 168 non-fatal opioid overdoses, life-saving Narcan was administered in 150 incidents.
