

## Trails at Robinson Nature Center

Situated on 18 acres of land, our grounds include approximately one mile of rugged, wooded trails.

Robinson's trails are accessible to pedestrian traffic when the building is closed. However, if you are driving to the Center, please note that the parking lot gates are only open during the building's hours of operation (see back of brochure for hours).

## Things to Remember

### Safety first

We close our trails if conditions are not safe. Trails may be closed in the case of high winds, tree work or required maintenance. Long-term and planned closures are posted on our website. Visitors can call 410-313-0400 to inquire about trail closures related to weather.

### Keep our trails wild

A variety of wildlife inhabit the nature center grounds. Please do not disturb wildlife you see.

### Leave dogs at home

Please do not bring dogs on our trails. Dogs may scare away wildlife that other visitors have come to see. Service animals are welcome.

### Take only pictures

Please do not remove plants or wildlife. We encourage you to explore our trails, but please use caution as poison ivy grows nearby.

### Leave only footprints

Please dispose of trash and recyclables properly. Receptacles are provided along sidewalks and inside the building.

### Take it slowly

These trails were designed for educational programs and the enjoyment of nature. As such, we ask that you refrain from running or biking here.

### Find treasures

Inquire at the front desk for self-guided geology tours of the trail and scavenger hunts. Keep an eye out for arboretum signage identifying trees and for wooden replicas of native bird species.

### Check yourself

Please take note that ticks, which may carry Lyme Disease, exist in this area. For more information on how to avoid, check for and remove ticks, please look for information in the kiosk or ask at our front desk.


