Detectives arrest nine men in prostitution operation

One charged with human trafficking after attempting to recruit undercover female officer

Howard County police conducted a reverse prostitution operation late last night, resulting in the arrest of eight men for solicitation of prostitution and related charges. An additional suspect was charged with human trafficking offenses after attempting to recruit an undercover officer.

Officers arrested the would-be johns for soliciting prostitution at a hotel in the 9800 block of Washington Boulevard in Laurel. As part of the operation, detectives placed fake ads on the website backpage, which is a site known to detectives to be used for prostitution. Men who called the number in the ad spoke with an undercover female officer who provided a meeting location upon the caller's request. When the men arrived and offered money for sex, they were arrested and charged with solicitation of prostitution and disorderly conduct:

- Harry Bernard Commarata Jr., 60, of Owings Mills
- David Cookson, 36, of Baltimore
- Peter Han, 43, of Herndon, VA
- Emanuel Nicholas Karas, 46, of Arnold
- Luis Alfredo Rodriguez, 33, of Hyattsville
- Mark David Stoessel, 62, of Severn
- Juvenile male, 15, of Adelphi

A ninth man, Matthew Ezekial Bogle, 32, of College Park, was charged with human trafficking and prostitution after trying to convince an undercover officer to travel to Virginia with him for the purpose of prostitution.

This operation is part of Howard County's ongoing effort to combat prostitution, human trafficking and related offenses. The HCPD also posts ads on relevant websites reminding people of the dangers and penalties of engaging in this kind of activity. The ads read:

LOOKING FOR A GIRL? POLICE ARE LOOKING FOR YOU.

HCPD has zero tolerance for Prostitution and Human Trafficking. If you commit these crimes, you WILL be arrested, prosecuted and your personal information released to the media.

If you are a victim, HCPD can offer housing, treatment and other help.
