Provides money for food for all children who received free and reduced-price meals in the past school year, or who qualified between school closure and June 15. Households receive up to \$370.50 per eligible child. If your child received free or reduced-priced meals before June 15, you should have received this new benefit automatically by mail, or had it loaded automatically on your SNAP card, if you have one. If you need additional assistance, call the numbers above.

HOUSING HELP

Because of executive orders by Maryland Gov. Hogan, until the COVID-19 State of Emergency order has been lifted:

- Landlords cannot evict residential tenants who have suffered loss of income due to COVID-19.
- Lenders cannot repossess cars, trucks, or mobile homes.
- Foreclosures on homes are prohibited for those who have suffered loss of income due to COVID-19.
- Also, a county bill prohibits the increase in rents for up to 90 days after the County's State of Emergency order is lifted.

Howard County COVID-19 Rental Assistance and Eviction Prevention

Apply for assistance with up to 3 months of housing expenses. Applicants must be Howard county residents with loss of income due to Covid-related job loss, reduction in hours and/or medical illness with a qualifying income.

A household needs to have income below the following: one person \$64,723, two persons \$73,96, three persons \$83,215, four persons \$92,461, five persons \$99,858.
