LIGHT BULB RECYCLING

Many light bulbs contain trace amounts of mercury and other hazardous material that must be handled properly. There are many drop-off and mail-in options to recycle and dispose of various household light bulbs.

No light bulbs are accepted in curbside recycling.

CFLs (bulbs & tubes)	Commonly used bulbs and tubes that use less energy than incandescent. Contains trace amounts of mercury and should not be disposed in household trash. Care should be taken to avoid breakage.
LED	Long lasting and very energy efficient! LED bulbs use less energy than CFLs and incandescent bulbs. Glass, metal and plastic can be readily recycled.
Halogen	Made from thicker glass and less prone to breakage. Some recycling options do exist, but these bulbs can also be set out in household trash. Wrap bulb before disposal.
Incandescent	Some recycling options do exist, but these bulbs can also be set out in household trash. Wrap bulb before disposal.
String lights	String lights contain copper which is valuable for recycling. Please bring these to the electronics section at the Alpha Ridge Landfill for proper recycling. Never put string lights (or other bulbs) in your curbside recycling.

Broken Bulbs?

CFLs and tubes contain trace amounts of mercury sealed in glass tubing. It is important to secure these bulbs, especially before recycling and disposal. In the event that a CFL breaks, please follow proper cleanup procedures. For bulbs that do not contain mercury (incandescent, LED, etc.) please be sure to wrap bulbs before disposal to protect collection staff.
