Planning Board approval for Warfield Neighborhood Concept Plan, the Warfield Neighborhood Implementation Plan, the Warfield Neighborhood Specific Design Guidelines (the “Warfield Neighborhood Design Guidelines”), and FDP-DC-W-2 for a 5.37-acre portion of the Warfield Neighborhood, Parcel A-3. The Petition proposes redeveloping the property within the Warfield Neighborhood with a maximum of 400,000 gross square feet of new commercial area, including a residential care facility containing 80 beds for assisted living and memory care. The Property’s redevelopment will also include up to 150 units of age-restricted adult housing dwelling units, associated amenities and a minimum 10 foot-wide shared-use pathway along Windstream Drive. The FDP proposes a maximum building height of 15 stories not to exceed 170 feet.
